About this Participation Statement


The Community Justice (Scotland) Act 2016 states that we should also publish information on the consultation and engagement we carried out as part of developing our community justice plan. This is called a Participation Statement.

Who are we talking about?

Our Community Justice Plan – Beginnings, Belonging, Belief – is for all of those affected by crime. That includes people involved in offending, their families, victims, communities and those working in the justice system.

We understand that all of these people are part of our community, and that in reality a single person can have many different experiences. For example a person may be a victim of crime but also have committed a crime. Or a person may work in the justice system, but also be a family member of someone involved in offending.

We understand that all of these groups overlap – what everyone has in common is that they are all <u>people</u> and members of the community first and foremost.




Who was involved in shaping our Plan?

We have had lots of conversations to shape our Plan. Thanks to everyone who took the time to share their views with us. On the following pages you can see our Consultation and Engagement Diary.¹ The diary mentions lots of different meetings, groups and partnerships. These include public, private and third sector partners, including groups representing victims and families involved in the justice system. You will also see some meetings and events involving prisoners, services users and local communities.

How did this influence the final version of the Plan?

We held a formal consultation period from 11 January to 24 February 2017. We have summarised the words and phrases used to describe the <u>strengths</u> of the draft Plan here. People said they liked the format, length and style of the draft Plan, and it was described as easy to read and understand, including by service users. The focus on assets, hope and change was welcomed and the Plan was described as empowering. It was felt to tie in well with both local community planning priorities and the national community justice approach. People said that that the inclusive and consultative approach taken in developing the Plan was clear to see, specifically the involvement of service users, families and people involved in the justice system. The benefits of some specific Commitments were highlighted, such as those around early intervention, prevention, families, mental health and trauma. The ways in which the Plan recognises the challenges of moving on from offending, and the need for a different approach, were also highlighted as a positive. To some extent, it was recognised that the Plan is relevant to all involved in the justice system, including victims and families.



People also suggested some <u>changes</u> we should make to the draft Plan, as shown here. We made these changes before we published the final version.
