Kinship Support

Supporting kinship families where substance use is a factor in the kinship placement.

Our aims include:

- Improved family relationships.
 - Support to access other relevant services.
 - Practical and emotional support.
 - Substance use awareness.
 - Linking young people and families in with their local communities.
 - Supporting families to reduce the need for further statutory intervention.
- Criteria for support is families who have young people in their care on a kinship bases where they have been placed in kinship through Social Work due to parental substance use.
 - A key aim of the service is to prevent placement breakdowns, therefore minimising further involvement of statutory services.
